**TASTING RESULTS ARE IN; ROOSTER HILL WINES ARE ‘VERY GOOD’**

Rooster Hill Vineyards has received a very good report card from Wine Enthusiast magazine, with three of its wines rated at 89 points.

Wine Enthusiast editors reviewed and rated the Rooster Hill wines and recently notified winery president and co-founder Amy Hoffman of the results.

The three highly rated Rooster Hill wines are the 2015 Estate Riesling; the 2014 Reserve Estate Grown and Produced Lemberger; and Bubbly Bantam, a white wine blend that is Rooster Hill’s first sparkling wine.

“It is exciting to have such a high level of quality at Rooster Hill and to have that quality recognized by a prestigious national wine magazine,” said Paige Vinson, the winery’s winemaker. “I look forward to using my education and international wine experience to bolster this already impressive wine portfolio.”

According to Wine Enthusiast’s scale, wines rated at 87 to 89 points are “Very Good; Often good value, well recommended.” Wine Enthusiast is one of the nation’s leading wine publications.

Rooster Hill’s 2014 Barrel Reserve Pinot Noir was also “Very Good,” receiving an 87 rating from Wine Enthusiast.

The 2015 Estate Riesling sells for \$16 a bottle, the 2014 Lemberger \$25, the Bubbly Bantam \$15, and the Pinot Noir \$25.
